PASTORAL LETTER: FEAST OF THE DEDICATION OF THE LATERAN BASILICA IN ROME

~ November 9, 2025 ~ November Saints and Souls

My dear Little Flower,

This week the Church celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome, the mother church of all churches in the world. It reminds us that every church building — including our own beloved Little Flower — is more than stone and wood; it is a living sign of God's dwelling among His people.

The Prophet Ezekiel describes water flowing from the temple, bringing life wherever it goes. St. Paul tells us that we ourselves are God's temple — His Spirit lives in us! And in the Gospel, Jesus reminds us that His own Body is the true temple, raised up in glory. Together, these readings teach us something beautiful: God's presence fills every heart that loves, forgives, and believes.

During this month of November, when we remember the *Saints and the Souls*, we look more *there* than *here* — our eyes lifted toward heaven and purgatory. The saints show us how to live as God's temples, filled with light and grace. The souls we pray for remind us that love continues beyond this life.

Here at Little Flower, our parish — our families, our children, our school — are like small chapels within God's great temple. Every act of kindness, every prayer whispered at bedtime, every sign of the cross made by a child keeps that holy presence alive in our midst.

So as we celebrate this feast, let us thank God for our parish home — for the walls that hold our prayers, for the altar that feeds us, and for the faith that makes us one family in Christ. And let us keep our hearts turned toward heaven, where all our saints and all our loved ones already share in God's eternal light.
