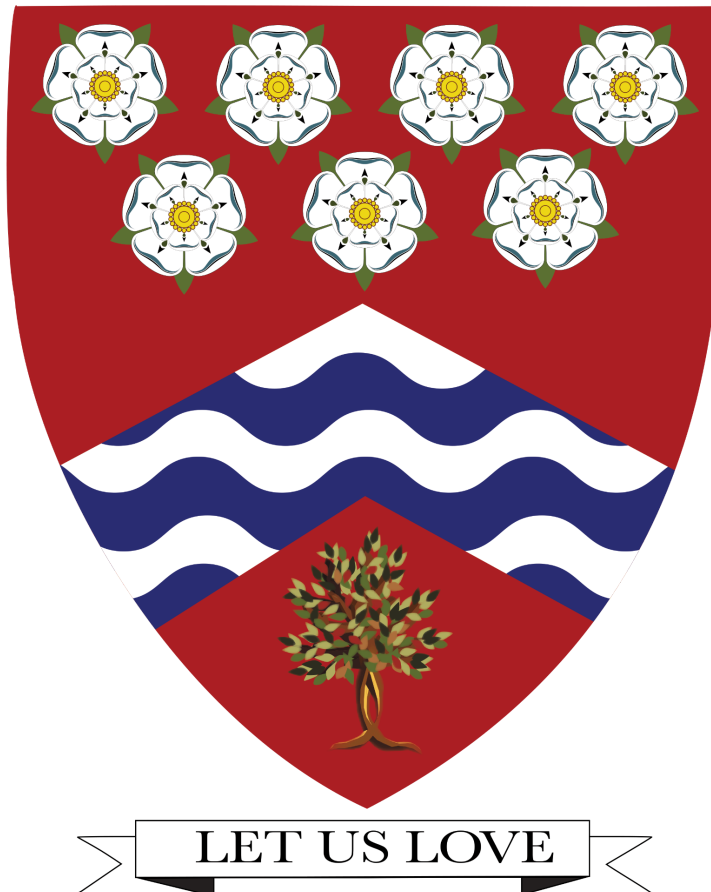

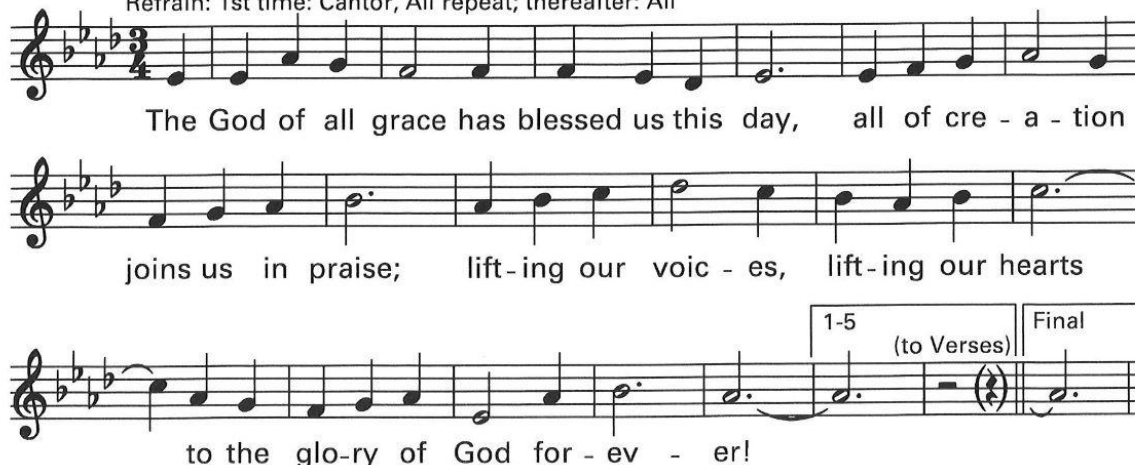

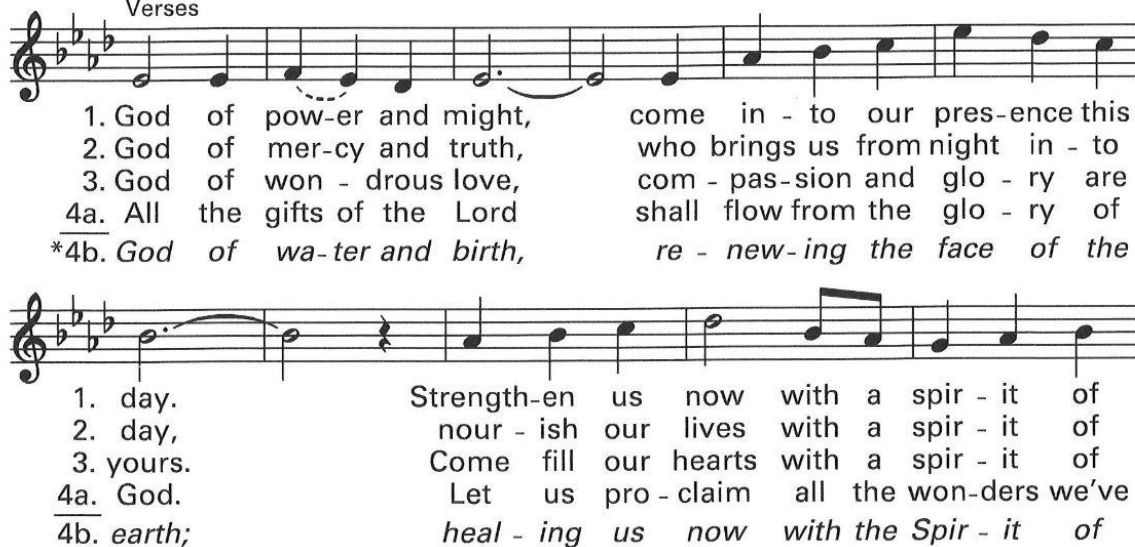

In those days, Amalek came and waged war against Israel.

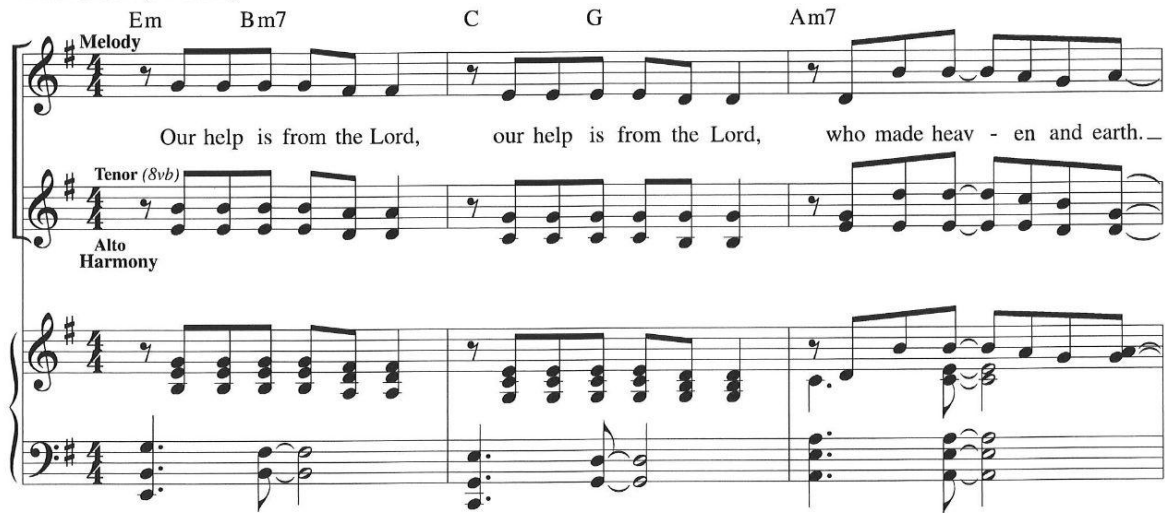

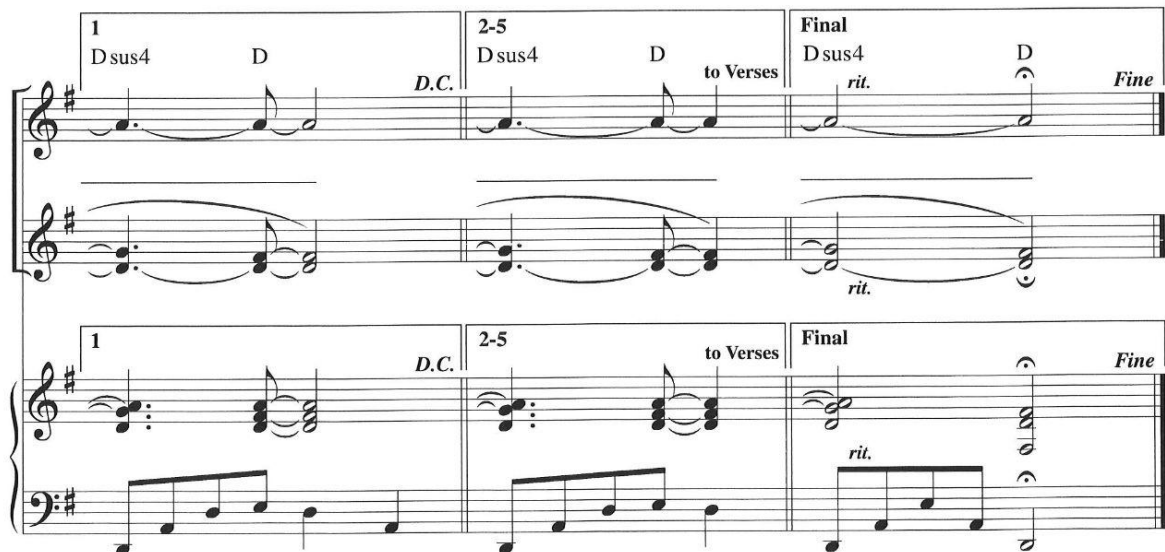

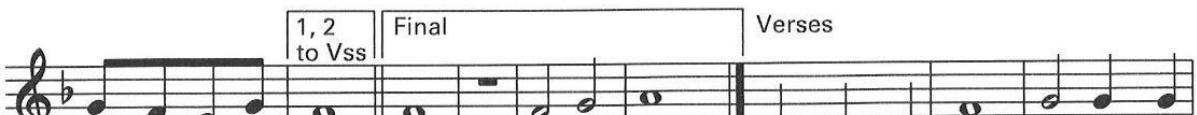
