


## PASTORAL LETTER

## Catechism of the Catholic Church





In the recent Diocesan
Synthesis on the Synod on
Synodality, Cardinal echoes
Pope Francis' invitation to all
parishes "to engage in a
synodal process of listening
to the Word of God and one
another, encounter with the
person of Jesus Christ, and
to discern God's will for His
Church".

It is the intent of the leadership of this parish community to explore the meaning of the pope's invitation. For the past year, we have been doing this - albeit in small baby steps. The trifold idea behind this synodal pilgrimage is this: Engage, Encounter, and Experience.

We engage in the community that loves you, encounter the Friend who knows you, and experience the light of Christ amidst a dark and confused world. Another word for "synodality" is to be on a listening journey together - a family of faith hand in hand, marching our way towards Jesus Christ. The goal of "synodality" - the goal of our pilgrimage - is "to find ways to connect the Gospel, the good news of Jesus Christ, to the everyday lives of the people". In this series of Catechesis (LF Teachings), we will continue to explore the deeper meaning to be a synodal church. We will respond to the invitation while learning what "Synodality in the LIfe and Mission of the Church means". For Little Flower parish, we will look into how we can engage, encounter, and experience the gospel of Jesus Christ in our everyday - ordinary - life.
