PASTORAL LETTER: TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

My dear Little Flower,

As we enter this Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Scriptures speak to us with striking clarity and boldness. Jesus says in Luke's Gospel, "I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!" These are not easy words to hear, but they are a necessary reminder that our faith is not meant to remain lukewarm. It is meant to burn—with love, with truth, with conviction.

In many ways, this summer has been a season of being kindled by that fire. I have seen it: in your commitment to prayer, your openness to God's voice in discernment, and the hunger for deeper formation in the faith. Like the prophet Jeremiah, who found himself in a pit for speaking God's truth, we are learning that discipleship sometimes costs us comfort - but it always brings us closer to Christ.
