
PILGRIM'S TRAVEL COMPANION

Dear Pilgrim,

But this is not just a journey through geography and history. This is a journey of the heart - *your* story, and *your* heart. You may be carrying burdens, questions, wounds, or weariness. Or maybe you're coming with quiet expectation, gratitude, or longing. Wherever you are on your journey — come as you are. Christ, our gentle Healer and Guide, walks with us. Mary, our Mother, intercedes. The saints accompany us.

Let each stop along the way be a holy pause: a chance to encounter God, to listen, to weep if needed, to rejoice when grace overflows, to surrender what has weighed heavy, and to welcome the peace the world cannot give.

Pilgrimage changes us — inwardly. And when we return home, we do not go back the same. A pilgrim always carries something home: a renewed heart, a rekindled hope, a clearer sense of mission.

So I invite you now—before we board a plane or step on a bus—to begin this journey in prayer. Ask the Holy Spirit: "What do You want to do in me, Lord, during this pilgrimage?"

Know that I will be with you praying for you, and your intentions, each day leading up to our departure. May this be a time of deep healing, joyful encounter, and abiding hope.

Our Lady, Queen of Peace—pray for us. St. Francis and St. Clare—pray for us. St. Padre Pio—pray for us. Sts. Peter and Paul—pray for us. St. Therese the Little Flower—pray for us. All holy men and women—pray for us.

Dear Pilgrims of Hope,

Peace in Christ.

As you set out on The Pilgrimage of Hope, know how close you are to my heart. I had so longed to walk this journey with you in person, but the Lord has written a different path for me in these days. My Papa fell ill while traveling from Manila and is now in the ICU in San Francisco. What I thought would be a joyful reunion has become instead a pilgrimage of its own — one of waiting, discernment, and walking closely with him in his fragility.

Even in this unexpected turn, I see God's hand at work. Papa has had the grace of reconciling with his brothers and sisters here in San Francisco after many years of distance. That gift of healing reminds me of the very heart of our pilgrimage together: that the Lord never abandons us, and that His plan, though often hidden, is always one of mercy, hope, and love.

I carry each of you and your intentions with me, and I ask that you carry mine as well — for my Papa's health, for my family's strength, and for my own openness to God's will. Though we may be apart in distance, we walk together in the Spirit, bound by the same faith and the same Lord who leads us forward.

So, walk with hope. Walk in healing. Walk with heart. And may every step you take open you more deeply to the God who surprises us with His grace.
